With over 7,000 chambers of commerce in the United States, only 204 chambers across the country have earned the Accreditation designation, and 128 are 5-Star. 


#### **BUSINESS TO BUSINESS LEADS GROUP (B2B)**

#### **CHAMBER FOUNDATION**

In January 2019, the Parker County Chamber of Commerce Foundation was organized as a not-for-profit 501(c)3 organization. The Foundation's purpose is to educate and assist the businesses of Parker County in disaster recovery. The eight member board of directors has worked to build a base of funds so that when a disaster hits our fair county, we will be able to respond, rebuild, and recover. To date, the Foundation has granted over \$50,250.01 back into the economy.


